PROLOGUE

Statistic Frenzy about sexual violence: Lights up on stage floor filled with ENSEMBLE members, bodies strewn about the stage and two empty chairs. The ENSEMBLE is shattered. ENSEMBLE members tap heartbeat rhythm on ground with hand, and proceed to rise individually, announcing statistics about rape and the lack of consent from today's media headlines.

Each Ensemble member gets one or two statistics. Please check current statistics. These were pulled in 2014.

INDIVIDUALLY

- 1. 1 in 4 women in college today has been the victim of rape
- 2. 90% of rape victims know their rapist
- 3. 90% of all campus rapes occur under the influence of alcohol
- 4. Of the college women who are raped, only 10% report the rape
- 5. 78% of the rapists were an acquaintance, friend or boyfriend of the victim
- 6. Every 2 minutes someone is sexually assaulted in the U.S.
- 7. Sexual assault is the most under reported crime in our country
- 8. The majority of all sexual offenders have been sexually assaulted in their lives
- 9. 40% of sexual assaults happen in victim's home
- 10. 97% of all rapists see no prison time
- 11. While you watch this play over 20 people will be sexually assaulted in the United States.

ENSEMBLE (TOGETHER)

While you watch this play over 20 people will be sexually assaulted in the United States.

Silence. ENSEMBLE faces the floor together.

After a still moment of silence, We hear stomp 1 and one ENSEMBLE member holds up a sign with the words "SCENE 1: PERPETRATOR", ENSEMBLE's heads remain down. Stomp 2, the ENSEMBLE poses in cheer pose and signs are flipped over to reveal "GO TEAM', "SCORE!!!", etc. Cheers directed House Center. Stomp 3 ENSEMBLE moves to crowd pose 2. Stomp 4 ENSEMBLE moves to crowd pose 3.

SCENE 1

Crowd continues talking in real time, two chairs are brought out center stage. PAT AND VEE peel out and immediately engage in conversation. ENSEMBLE grabs bags and freeze after VEE's first "Hey."

VEE

Hey, what's up? Beat Are you okay?

PAT

What? Oh, yeah, um no...I'm okay.

VEE

You sure?

PAT

Mhmm.

VEE

Are you heading home?

PAT

No, I uh... don't wanna go home yet.

VEE

Well, me neither. You've got a car, why don' we go for a drive?

PAT

Where?

VEE

I know a place.

PAT AND VEE walk in a small circle. ENSEMBLE gets rowdy and moves two seats in to serve as car seats as PAT AND VEE walk. PAT and VEE enter the 'car.' ENSEMBLE provides cartoonish sound effects that play up the storyline (auto unlock, door open, seat belts, radio "Blured Lines"

song, etc.) PAT and VEE drive to the location, park and are looking out over a vista. Note: The 'car' should be created simply with pantomime-this is part of the play's language and should be adhered to throughout. Car scenes always take place DS of the sports crowds, frozen in celebration.

VEE

Isn't it amazing out here?

РАТ

Yeah.

VEE

Have you ever been out here?

PAT

I've been here by myself once, but I haven't come here with anyone.

Car stops. VEE tries to kiss PAT. PAT dodges the advance and pulls away confused.

PAT

What're you doing?

VEE

Oh, ha, I thought you wanted to.

PAT

I mean...maybe...

VEE

What's the problem, you're alone, in a car, out here, with a girl? I mean you're a GUY for Christ sake!

PAT

Something's been bugging me, and I want to tell you before we do anything, but I need to know I can trust you...

VEE

You can always trust me.

PAT

Oh boy.

PAT reaches under his seat and grabs a bottle of liquor.
