

Session Descriptions

Gaitrie Subryan

Gaitrie Subryan is a Choreographer, Dancer, Teaching Artist, Yoga Instructor, and Podcast Host, based in Buffalo, NY. Gaitrie learned to embrace her Indian roots while studying Psychology at the University at Buffalo, where she took part in dance performances through the student association. She has worked with youth and adults through the transformative power of movement, music, and storytelling. She uses movement to promote emotional, social, cognitive, and physical integration to improve physical health and well-being. Gaitrie has a background in Bollywood, Bhangra, and Garba dance, but it has been her training in Kathak, an Indian Classical dance form from Northern India, which has given her the foundation she needs to make stories come alive. She takes students on an inward journey, they work through various movement-based exercises and will then use their movements to share a story from their childhood.

SBL Processing!

The Anne Frank Project Staff will lead students to process what they are feeling into action after each session. In Story-Based Learning fashion, students will share physical movements with each other that will create a sense of community, and encourage identity and inclusion practices.

Sophia Veffler

Witness the amazing, personal stories of Sophia Veffler, Holocaust survivor and AFP board member. Sophia went to school with Anne Frank in Amsterdam, and will share her emotional journey as a young Jewish Dutch girl who miraculously survived Hitler's concentration camps. Sophia will remind students how the power of traumatic stories can connect us in an increasingly divisive world. A question/answer session will follow her story.
